



DE&I UPDATE

Throughout February, our department used social media to highlight just a few of our Black community members who have made an impact in Columbus throughout the history of the City. The list of those highlighted can be seen below:

- <u>William Adams</u> Known for being an active member within the Columbus community, he served for the Department of Defense, Krumm Park Community Recreation Council, and Columbus Recreation and Parks Commission, to name a few. William H. Adams Community Center bears his name to honor him.
- <u>James "Buster" Douglas</u> A former professional boxer who became the linear heavyweight boxing champion when he knocked out Mike Tyson on Feb. 11, 1990. He is now a boxing coach at Thompson Community Center.
- <u>Jerry Hammond</u> A member of Columbus City Council from 1974-1990, he became the first Black president of the Columbus City Council in 1984. In 2007, the building at 1111 East Broad Street, where our department and the 311 City Services Call Center are headquartered, became known as the Jerry Hammond Center.
- <u>Mayme Moore</u> A Civil Rights activist who stood alongside Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Washington, D.C., as he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech. She helped found the Columbus chapter of the NAACP, and Mayme Moore Park is named after her.
- Bettye Stull She served as the administrative coordinator for our department, where she worked for over 30 years. After her retirement, she continued her passion for helping her community and became a curator at the King Arts Complex. For her extensive work that inspired and showcased Black art and talent, Stull has won multiple awards.
