## ULRY-WARNER MASTER PLAN

The Master Plan is sensitive to the existing conditions of the site while responding to the growing needs of Northeast Columbus neighborhoods. Hundreds of public input comments have been instrumental in identifying and prioritizing the proposed park elements. This input has also shaped the following planning principles for this park.

- Protect the natural assets of this special property including the woodlands, the hedgerows and existing wetland features.
- Provide recreational opportunities for all age groups, including a balance of active and passive uses.
- Enhance connectivity to the existing (and planned) network of sidewalks, trails and shared-use paths.

The park consists of three distinct zones. The south zone, with access to Ulry and Warner Roads, will be the most active district of the park with multi-purpose fields, hardcourts, a picnic shelter, and a playground. The north zone is accessed from Central College Road and will include a four-season pavilion. The north and south zones are connected by a shared-use path that allows visitors to access the most scenic aspects of the property including mature woodlands, open meadows and wetlands. Special moments along the path will include swings and lounge chairs allowing visitors to immerse themselves in nature.

## SHELTER & PLAYGROUND

Accessible from the Ulry and Warner Road entrances, the open air shelter is surrounded by several amenities located in the southern part of the park including, multi-purpose fields, playgrounds, hardcourts and picnic areas.

## FOUR SEASON PAVILION

Located off of the Central College Road entrance, the four season pavilion is conveniently placed next to the parking lot, north trail head and the multi-use path that runs the length of the site from north to south.

### PLAYGROUND & NATURE PLAY

Located directly adjacent to the shelter, the playground and nature play area provide a stimulating environment to keep kids of all ages active while encouraging creativity and interaction.

## TRAILHEADS & PASSIVE RECREATION

Each trailhead (north and south) is connected by a 10' wide multi-use path that runs the length of the site. Passive seating areas are discovered along the way complete with lounge chairs and swings.
