- What's new in the last 18 months? The VOICE program has been making steady strides toward expanding its work in the community. One of its major goals was to establish direct and streamlined access to community resources for all participants, which is now possible thanks to a multitude of community-based stakeholders and agencies. VOICE has successfully extended its services to OSU East Hospital for the summer/fall season and is currently in talks with other major hospitals for further expansion. This development will help VOICE better connect and support participants in obtaining their needs in a quicker and more efficient process.
- What is the section's core function? The VOICE Program is a hospital-based intervention program. VOICE works with individuals who have been victimized from a gunshot wound, stabbing and/or assault and provides intensive case management services for participants who reside in the City of Columbus and were referred by Grant Hospital.
- What benefits do you provide to staff or residents? VOICE serves as a valuable connector for both staff and residents. The VOICE team has been utilized by the department for the resources it gathers while working in the community. By sharing the resources and opportunities provided by companies and agencies, VOICE can better assist members of the community.
- How do staff or residents interact with your section? The VOICE program operates as a referral-based system for case management services. In addition to assisting participants who have been victims of recent crime, we also strive to provide assistance to the entire household that was impacted by the traumatic experience of violence. The VOICE program also provides a three-month participant survey as well as a discharge survey. The feedback from participants has remained positive.
- What are some fun facts about the section? The VOICE Program also provides support to the community by participating in events that showcase solidarity with our partners and those in need. We like to celebrate our participants' achievements along the road to self-sufficiency, and have organized various events and experiences to that end, such as taking participants and their families to the zoo for a mental health wellness day and utilizing our community centers for wellness experiences with participants, such as the Cap City Experiences. Additionally, we are proud to share that there has been zero re-victimization among VOICE participants at this time.
- Do you have any additional information to share with the department? The VOICE Program is now a member of the Health Alliance for Violence Intervention (HAVI), which is recognized as one of the most credential spaces for intervention. Additionally, VOICE partners with national organization Crime Survivors for Safety & Justice (CSSJ) to advocate and provide support to individuals who have been victims of crimes.
