DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION

What is something new that your section has implemented in the last 18 months? We have continued to greatly expand in the last 18 months; our full time staff has nearly doubled! Working closely with the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, we have added Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goals into our larger projects. We have also implemented Smartsheet to track our projects and increase efficiency.

What is your section's core function? Our core function is to provide quality, functional and sustainable infrastructure that connects our communities to the power of nature, wellness and creativity.

How do you benefit residents? As highlighted in our core function, we benefit the community through building and renovating infrastructure, playgrounds, site furnishings, pools and more to create additional opportunities for our residents to build a connection to nature, wellness and creativity.

How do residents and customers interact with you? We communicate with other sections to make sure their needs are met on projects. We focus on stakeholder engagement and also interact with residents through Commission meetings and community meetings.

How many staff are in your section? We have 12 staff consisting of our administrator, five project managers, three engineering associates, one maintenance manager, one part-time inspector and one management analyst. We are still growing! We're actively looking to hire an additional facility project manager, full-time inspector and intern.

Do you have fun facts about your section? Our team has spent an average of 2.83 years with the department, and 8.66 years with the City. We currently have 75 active projects with over 260 active sites spread across more than 30 communities.

NEW EXTERNAL INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY NOW IN EFFECT

The department's new external inclement weather policy aims to provide consistent and uniform guidelines for the operation of department facilities during inclement weather to ensure the health, safety and well-being of participants, volunteers and staff. The policy also takes into consideration the risk of damage inclement weather may pose to department facilities.

The policy states that: In the event of inclement weather, Columbus Recreation and Parks reserves the right to close facilities and/or postpone or cancel recreational activities to protect the safety and well-being of the community.

and preserve the integrity of department facilities. The department also may offer resources to offer residents a safe place to shelter from inclement weather.

The new policy addresses the steps to be taken in the event of snow emergencies or extreme cold (anything below 20° Fahrenheit) or extreme heat (four consecutive days of 90° Fahrenheit or higher), as well as severe spring and summer weather (i.e. thunderstorms, heavy rain, tornado, etc.).

Additionally, the policy also addresses the steps to be taken, internally and externally, to communicate the changes to facility operations. Read the full policy so you know what to expect during inclement weather.




