# SPOTLIGHT ON DEI

### **NEW LANGUAGE POLICY IMPROVES ACCESS FOR RESIDENTS**

Today we are highlighting the Language policy, which was most recently updated in July. Highlights of the policy include:

**Communicating in Multiple Languages:** The department communicates information in multiple languages in several ways:

- The department's website can be translated into 11 different languages.
- ACTIVEnet, our external registration software system, can be translated into Spanish.
- Pool rules signs contain a QR code that, when scanned, directs people to the department's website.
- SOME printed materials are translated into Spanish and Somali.
- Augmentative and Alternative Communications (AAC) boards are added to all new playgrounds.

Translation and Interpretation Services: The department partners with the Department of Neighborhood's Translation and Interpretation Services to translate documents, or to provide interpretation services.

**Recruiting:** It is important that the department's staff represent the community it serves. The department takes steps to recruit diverse candidates, and candidates who can speak languages other than English. The department takes the following action:

- Promote job openings in media outlets to reach diverse audiences.
- Promote job openings in locations that predominantly communicate in languages other than English.
- Department banner offers instructions in English, Spanish and Somali.

The Latino Heritage Month Committee is hosting the Latino Heritage Parade kick-off this year's Latino Heritage Month celebrations. The inaugural committee was formed out of the office of Columbus City Councilmember Lourdes Barroso de Padilla to promote visibility, cultural awareness and togetherness during Latino Heritage Month in hopes of creating lasting impact in the greater Columbus community.

This year, the parade will take place on Saturday, Sept. 16, from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. (please arrive by 9:20), starting at Rich Street Bridge and finishing at City Hall, where the Latino Heritage Festival will be held. Our department has put together a Passion Team to march in the parade. Join your coworkers and celebrate culture, community and diversity as we parade through downtown Columbus.

#### **Upcoming Important Dates**

- National Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15 Oct. 15): Celebrates and recognizes the contributions and influence of Hispanic Americans to the history, culture and achievements for the United States. The beginning of this month coincides with the independence day for several Latin American countries such as Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua (Sept. 15), Mexico (Sept. 16) and Chile (Sept. 18)
- Rosh Hashanah (Sept. 15-17): Celebrates the Jewish New Year. It is one of two "High Holy Days" of Judaism and begins a 10-day period of penitence culminating in Yom Kippur.
- Yom Kippur (Sept. 15-17): The holiest day in Judaism and Samaritanism, it occurs annually on the 10th of Tishrei, corresponding to a secular date in September or early October. It is primarily centered on atonement and repentance, with the day's main observances consisting of full fasting and ascetic behavior accompanied by long prayer services in synagogue.
- **HeForShe (Sept. 20):** A solidarity movement for the advancement of gender equality, initiated by the United Nations. Grounded in the idea that gender inequality is an issue that affects all people, socially, economically and politically, HeForShe seeks to involve men and boys in achieving equality by taking action against negative gender stereotypes and behaviors.



### QUALIFYING LIFE EVENTS AND BENEFITS CHANGES

Outside of Open Enrollment, you may make changes to your insurance coverage within 30 days of a Qualifying Life Event, such as a birth, marital status change, or loss or gain of other insurance coverage. It's easy to submit your benefit changes or enrollment on <u>Dayforce</u>: Navigate to the "Forms" tab and complete the "Life Event Declaration." Once approved, you will need to complete a "Life Event Enrollment" to enroll or make changes to your coverage.
