NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: CELEBRATING THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF WOMEN, INSPIRING GIRLS

Columbus is filled with women who made or continue to make history, and Columbus Recreation and Parks' facilities reflect that. Look no further than the <u>Priscilla R. Tyson Cultural Arts Center</u> or the soon-to-be <u>Fran Ryan Center</u>, named after women who positively impacted our community.

Our department continues to celebrate women and girls alike beyond naming buildings after women who made history. On March 16, we will host <u>Girls Empowerment Day</u>, an annual event meant to unite and celebrate young girls in our community as they participate in engaging sessions and self-reflective activities. IMPORTANT DATES

- National Women's History Month (March): This annual observance is dedicated to recognizing and celebrating the contributions and achievements of women throughout history as well as in contemporary society.
- **Gender Equality Month (March):** This observance is dedicated to raising awareness against gender bias in society.
- International Women's Day (March 8): This global holiday is celebrated annually as a focal point in the women's rights movement. It focuses on issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women.
- **St. Patrick's Day (March 17):** A Christian and cultural holiday, St. Patrick's Day honors the traditional death date of Saint Patrick, the foremost patron saint of Ireland.
- Ramadan (March 10 April 9): Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, observed by Muslim worldwide as a month of fasting (sawm), prayer, reflection and community.
