CELEBRATE OLDER AMERICANS MONTH WITH COLUMBUS RECREATION AND PARKS

May is Older Americans Month, and it's as good a time as any to talk about some of the many services our department offers to residents aged 50 and up, some of which you may already know about.

Our <u>FiftyPlus</u> program grants residents access to moderate- to high-activity programs and active relaxation programs designed just for them. This includes creativity, nature, wellness and special interest classes, as well as community events such as the upcoming 50+ Craft and Yard Sale and the 50+ Spring Mixer at Dodge Community Center. <u>Check the schedule for the community center near you for a complete list of activities and events</u>.

FiftyPlus members also have access to senior fitness centers and senior sports programs. Some members may be eligible for a free one-year fitness pass and an adult sports pass if they have certain <u>insurance-sponsored programs</u>.

In addition to the FiftyPlus program, our department also features the <u>Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging</u> (COAAA), which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year! As part of its mission, COAAA plans, funds and delivers services that help older adults and individuals with disabilities remain safe and independent in their homes. The agency serves eight counties: Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway and Union.

Last but not least, our community centers also offer <u>Walk With A Doc</u>, where participants walk with a doctor and learn about health while earning points they can redeem for prizes at the end of the year. These events are held every Saturday from April 6 to Oct. 26 at various community centers.

As you can see, there's plenty we offer to older residents, so spread the word! English

IMPORTANT DATES

- Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (May): Recognizes the contributions and influence of Asian Americans and Pacific Islander Americans to the history, culture and achievements of the United States. President George H. W. Bush initially designated May Asian Pacific American Heritage Month in 1992 before renaming it to its current moniker on May 1, 2009.
- **Jewish American Heritage Month (May):** An annual recognition and celebration of Jewish Americans' achievements and contributions to the history, culture and achievements of the United States. President George W. Bush first proclaimed the month on April 20, 2006.
- Mental Health Awareness Month (May): Helps raise awareness about mental health and encourages individuals to talk openly about it. It was started in the U.S. in 1949 by Mental Health America. Each year, Mental Health America releases a toolkit of materials. This year's theme is Where to Start.
- Older Americans Month (May): A national month recognizing the achievements and vitality of older people. President John F. Kennedy established the month in May 1963.

CHECK OFF YOUR ANNUAL ETHICS TRAINING REQUIREMENT BEFORE SUMMER

As public servants, we hold ourselves to a higher standard. We serve our residents, and they expect us to operate in an ethical manner. That's why every City employee completes ethics training each year.

This year's course - 50 Years of Promoting Governmental Ethics - challenges you to apply your knowledge regarding the Ohio Ethics Law, including gifts, conflicts of interest, public contracts, nepotism, post-employment and representation. This one-hour online training is available through the Training Gateway, so you can set aside the best time for you.

If you still need to complete annual ethics training, you should have received an email assigning you to the training. If assigned, you must complete the training by July 29.
