During the 1990s, Columbus saw a large influx of Somali immigrants, many of them coming as refugees looking to escape the ongoing civil war. Although many Somalis initially came to other parts of the U.S., many eventually moved to Columbus, largely due to the low cost of living and affordable housing. Today, according to the Somali Community Association of Ohio, 45-50,000 Somalis live in Columbus.

Columbus' Somali community is thriving, with many Somali Americans establishing successful businesses. One such example is Hoyo's Kitchen, a Somali cuisine restaurant. Established in 2014 on the North Side, Hoyo's Kitchen now boasts three central Ohio locations in the North Market, Dublin and New Albany.

Likewise, many Somali Americans from Columbus have gone on to make names for themselves while positively impacting the City. Two such individuals are Ohio House District 3 Representatives Isail Mohamed and Munira Abdullahi, who became the first two Somali-American representatives in Ohio in December 2022.

As part of our inclusivity and accessibility efforts, the department consistently creates marketing collateral in Somali, the third-most spoken language in Columbus. Our website can also be translated into Somali (as well as 11 other languages!), making it accessible to our Somali-speaking residents.


July 15 is also the department's birthday – this year, we're 114 years old!
