SPOTLIGHT ON DE&I

THE ORIGINAL PEOPLE OF COLUMBUS

We often talk about Columbus' growing population and what it may look like in the future. In honor of International Day of the World's Indigenous People, this month we look at some of the original people of central Ohio.

Between roughly 3500 BCE (Before the Common Era) to the 16th century, central Ohio was home to many groups of indigenous cultures who constructed mounds and earthworks and are often referred to as Mound Builders. These mounds were typically flat-topped or rounded cones and served as burial and ceremonial structures. One of the last remaining ancient conical burial mounds is <u>Shrum Mound</u>, which can be found within Columbus city limits.

Some of the last known Native American nations to live in central Ohio are now referred to in English as the Delaware, Mingo, Shawnee and Wyandot. This area was home to several villages scattered throughout Franklin County, the largest of which was a Mingo village located on the banks of the Scioto River.

Recently, Experience Columbus compiled a list of <u>six destinations around Columbus where you can view earthworks</u> and <u>artifacts that showcase Native American history</u>. This month, take some time to visit some of these sites and learn about the original people of central Ohio.

ONLINE REPLAY: THE SOMALI EXPERIENCE

If you weren't able to attend *The Somali Experience*, a Lunch & Learn hosted by the DEI Committee, you can <u>watch an online replay</u>.

This informative event focused on Somalia, the Somali Diaspora and Columbus' burgeoning Somali population. Fatuma Bulle, one of our intervention specialists with Youth Development, served as a guest speaker. Fatuma, who speaks four languages, talked about her experience living through a civil war in Somalia, as well as moving to the U.S. She also shared some insight into Somali costumes and suggested some best practices to ensure cultural awareness when working with our Somali residents. Attendees also sampled traditional Somali cuisine of sambusas and cookies and viewed some Somali garments. The event was the highest-attended DE&I Lunch & Learn to date!

BALANCING WORK AND FAMILY: CHILDREN IN THE WORKPLACE POLICY

We understand that occasional visits by employees' children happen for various reasons. However, the regular or extended presence of children during work hours is not allowed due to work interruptions, health and safety concerns, and liability issues. The <u>Children in the Workplace Policy</u> is designed to help balance workplace and family needs.

The policy clarifies when children are allowed in the workplace, including when they are making a brief visit, such as to meet your co-workers or in the event of an emergency (please note that your section head must approve this, and submit the approval in writing to Human Resources). It clarifies your responsibilities as a caregiver. It also states that, when possible, supervisors should work to honor requests for flexibility.


