RECOGNIZING INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Observed annually on Dec. 3, the <u>International Day of Persons with Disabilities</u> highlights the importance of understanding disability issues and supporting the dignity, rights and well-being of individuals with disabilities. Promoted by the United Nations since 1992, this day serves as a global call to action.

This year's theme, "Amplifying the Leadership of Persons with Disabilities for an Inclusive and Sustainable Future," emphasizes the essential contributions of individuals with disabilities in shaping an inclusive world. It also underscores the importance of their involvement in decision-making processes connected to key global initiatives, such as the Pact for the Future and the 2030 Agenda. These efforts aim to promote leadership opportunities for persons with disabilities across all levels. 

LAST CALL: ENROLL IN FREE CREDIT MONITORING FOR EXTRA PEACE OF MIND

As part of our commitment to protecting your personal information, the City is offering free Experian credit monitoring for all current and past City employees, Franklin County Municipal Court Judges and Clerk employees, and anyone else who may have shared personal information with the City. This service includes two years of credit monitoring across all three credit bureaus, identity theft restoration with insurance, and dark web monitoring.

All current staff should have received enrollment instructions by mail around the week of Aug. 5. If not, just reach out to your department's HR Officer/Manager for assistance.

Former employees, residents and others eligible for this coverage can easily sign up by visiting <u>Columbus.gov/Services/Cybersecurity</u> or by calling 833-918-5161 with the code B129832. Be sure to enroll by Nov. 29!
