NEW SMARTSHEET TICKETING SYSTEM IMPROVES TECH SUPPORT

Have a technology issue for the Technology Team? We've streamlined our support process with a new Smartsheet ticketing system that gets your request directly to the department's Tech Team—no delays, no extra steps.

As soon as you submit a ticket, our team is immediately notified and begins processing your issue, ensuring you don't have to wait for DoT (Department of Technology) to filter through requests. If we need to involve DoT, we'll submit the ticket on your behalf and closely monitor its progress to guarantee a timely solution.
