## **IMPORTANT DATES**

- Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (May): Recognizes the contributions and influence of Asian Americans and Pacific Islander Americans to the history, culture and achievements of the United States. President George H. W. Bush initially designated May Asian Pacific American Heritage Month in 1992 before renaming it to its current moniker on May 1, 2009.
- **Jewish American Heritage Month (May):** Recognizes and celebrates Jewish Americans' achievements and contributions to the history, culture and achievements of the United States. President George W. Bush first proclaimed the month on April 20, 2006.
- **Mental Health Awareness Month (May):** Raises awareness about mental health and encourages individuals to talk openly about it. It was started in the U.S. in 1949 by <u>Mental Health America</u>. Each year, Mental Health America releases a <u>toolkit of materials</u>. This year's theme is Where to Start.
- Older Americans Month (May): Recognizes the achievements and vitality of older people. President John F. Kennedy established the national month in May 1963.
- World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development (May 21): Highlights the richness of the world's culture and the essential role of intercultural dialogue for achieving peace and development that is sustainable. The observance was established in 2002 by the United Nations.
- **Memorial Day (May 26):** Honors and mournd the U.S. military personnel who died while serving the U.S. Armed English orial Day is a federal holiday.


Known as The Docks Crew, these staff members are pulled from various locations within our section to tackle this highly specialized, physically demanding job. Here's what they do:

- Install 316 dock spaces for public rental
- Set up seven boat launch ramps across all three reservoirs
- Complete the full installation before the May 1 deadline
- Conduct weekly inspections and repairs
- Return in fall (starting Nov. 1) to remove and store the docks for winter

Working on water in freezing temps—often in the 30s and 40s with biting wind—makes this one of the most challenging seasonal tasks we take on. And yet, year after year, this crew meets their deadlines and ensures a safe and successful boating season for our community.

The current crew includes Lucas Easterbrook, Tim Monahan, Russ Swank, Taylor Evans, Ryan Allen and Scott Curtis. We'd also like to recognize Mike Plageman, the longest-serving member of the crew, who wasn't able to participate this year but provided valuable input and support throughout the process.
