THE SOMALI MUSEUM OF OHIO

Ohio is home to the second-largest Somali population in the U.S., and Columbus' vibrant Somali community is a testament to that. In addition to the numerous Somali-owned businesses and restaurants in the city, Columbus can now boast of having its own Somali Museum—the Somali Museum of Ohio.

The museum, which opened its doors last year, is located at the International Mall (1780 Morse Rd.), and boasts a collection of Somali artifacts, including traditional garments, musical instruments and tools, as well as artwork, crafts, photos, documents and other items that help tell the story of Somali life.

IMPORTANT DATES

- **Pride Month (June):** A month dedicated to honoring the movement for LGBTQ+ rights and celebrating the LGBTQ+ culture and community. It began after the Stonewall riots, a series of gay liberation protests in 1969, and has since spread outside of the United States.
- Caribbean-American Heritage Month (June): Celebrates the achievements and contributions of Caribbean immigrants and their descendants living in the United States.
- **Juneteenth (June 19):** Commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. The name comes from combining "June" and "nineteenth." It is celebrated on the anniversary of the order proclaiming freedom for slaves in Texas. Which was issued on June 19, 1865.
- World Refugee Day (June 20): An international day organized to celebrate and honor refugees from around the world. The day was first established on June 20, 2001 by the United Nations.
- **Somali Independence Day (July 1):** A national holiday observed in Somalia to celebrate the unification of the Trust Territory of Somaliland and the State of Somaliland into the Somali Republic on July 1, 1960.
- Independence Day (July 4): A federal holiday commemorating the Declaration of Independence, which was ratified by the Second Continental Congress on July 4, 1776, establishing the United States of America.

Dayforce Tip: Don't Forget the Paperwork

Managers and timekeepers—if you adjust or enter a punch on an employee's timesheet in Dayforce, make sure it's backed up with a Time and Attendance Form.

Once the change is made in Dayforce, submit the completed form to HR for recordkeeping. This ensures transparency, consistency and compliance for everyone involved.

FORGING MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL RELATIONSHIPS


The department will often work with outside organizations to enhance our offerings and supplement our work. To ensure every organization is treated the same and there's a clear understanding about what each group is responsible for, these partnerships are documented, often in a Memorandums of Understanding (MOU).

The Policy & Legal team is strengthening the processes around these partnerships. Here are three things to keep in mind:

- Not every partnership needs an MOU. Some relationships don't require formal documentation and that's perfectly fine.
- All MOUs will start at the section level. Teams will continue developing relationships and initiating agreements.
- Legal & Policy will manage the approval process. This
 takes the pressure off sections and ensures that all
 agreements follow a standard, consistent process.

OWN THE MOMENT: QUICK THINKING STOPS FIRE AT DOG PARK

While leaving the shop after lunch, Parks team members Derrick Darr and Samuel Mwangi spotted something unusual—thick white smoke coming from a parked car in the Big Walnut Dog Park parking lot. Trusting their instincts, they owned the moment and stepped in to help.

Inside the car, a woman was napping with the engine running. Derrick knocked on the window to alert her to the smoke, which appeared to be coming from the rear of the vehicle. When she turned off the engine and opened the trunk, the situation escalated. Smoke began to fill the cab, and as fresh air entered the trunk, a bag of laundry suddenly

burst into flames.

Derrick rushed to grab a fire extinguisher from their work truck and was able to knock down the flames. He and Sam then carefully removed the smoldering items from the car. Some of the clothing reignited, but Derrick was ready—he used the extinguisher again to fully put out the fire.

Once the fire was under control, the pair loaded the charred materials into a wheelbarrow, soaked them thoroughly at the shop, and secured them in a dump truck. Meanwhile, the driver

contacted the fire department to ensure her vehicle was safe.



Thanks to Derrick and Sam owning the moment, the fire was quickly contained—and a potentially dangerous situation was prevented. The woman was deeply grateful, and their quick thinking is a great reminder of how everyday awareness and taking action can make a big difference.
