IMPORTANT CHANGE: PPO OPEN ENROLLMENT MOVES TO OCTOBER

Big news—Open Enrollment is moving up. This year's enrollment period will run Oct. 27-Nov. 30, and it will be the **only Open Enrollment for 2026 coverage.** The spring

PPO-only enrollment is no longer offered.

Both PPO and HDHP plans will be available during this fall enrollment. Elections made in October and November will be in effect Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2026.



Good news: After you receive the email confirming your migration to Office 365, you'll be able to access City email on your phone. Do this:

- Delete old apps: Remove Boxer and Absolute Secure Access.
- Download Outlook: Install the Microsoft Outlook app.
- Sign in: Use your City username and regular City password.
- If you see "government account detected" and the app closes, reopen Outlook—your email will appear.

HOW WE LIFT EACH OTHER UP WITH CREATIVE

SOLUTIONS

Columbus Recreation and Parks piloted its first-ever goat grazing program at Antrim Park—and it was a win for conservation, the community and our values.

This passion project of Conservation Horticulturist Specialist II Pam Steck showed how we Lift Each Other Up by supporting bold ideas. Instead of contractors and heavy equipment, goats from Goats on the Go Columbus Northwest grazed two acres of steep terrain, clearing invasive plants like honeysuckle, tree of heaven and poison ivy. The approach saved money, reduced fuel use and created healthier habitats.

Thanks to promotion by Tina Mohn and Stephanie Garling, the project received weeks of media coverage, sparking community interest and excitement. Residents enjoyed watching the goats in action, and now Antrim Lake has clearer views where invasive plants once blocked the shoreline. A perfect example of how we Build Strong Connections while leading in conservation!
