OBSERVANCES

- Native American Heritage Month (November): Honors the history, culture and contributions of Native Americans, as well as their impact on the nation.
- All Saints' Day (Nov. 1): Christian holiday that honors all the saints in the church. Some Christian denominations consider all Christians as saints. Also known as All Hallows' Day.
- **Dia de Los Muertos (Nov. 1-2):** Remembers loved ones who have passed away by sharing a meal with them as they would have when they were alive. Celebrated by Mexicans and those of Mexican heritage.
- **Veterans Day (Nov.11):** Honors all who have served in the U.S. armed forces. This federal holiday is observed on the anniversary of the end of World War I.



- Iransgender Day of Remembrance (Nov. 20): Memorializes those who have been murdered as a result of transphobia. Started in 1999 to honor Rita Hester, a transgender woman who was killed in 1998.
- **Thanksgiving (Nov. 27):** Federal holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal commemorating a harvest festival celebrated by the Pilgrims and Native Americans in 1621.

COMBINED OPEN ENROLLMENT IS HERE: REVIEW CHANGES AND MAKE YOUR ELECTIONS

For the first time, the City of Columbus is moving to one combined Open Enrollment for PPO and HDHP medical plans – no more separate spring PPO enrollment. From Oct. 27-Nov. 30, you can add or remove covered dependents, enroll in coverage, switch plans or waive coverage, and update your 2026 HSA contributions.

In addition to a new enrollment date, the City is moving to a new medical insurance carrier, Anthem BCBS, so it's important to thoroughly review your options this year.

Here's what you need to do:

- 1. **Review the 2026 plan information.** You can find this in the <u>Open Enrollment Home Mailer</u>, which was mailed to you (if you don't receive this mailer in the coming days, check to make sure your home address is current in Dayforce). Please note: 2026 premiums are being finalized and will be shared around Nov. 1. You'll soon be able to access a list of in-network providers. Watch for emails from Employee Benefits and Wellness with this information; we'll also share information with all staff.
- 2. **Make your elections in Dayforce.** The type of medical coverage you're currently enrolled in will determine if you need to take action:
 - 1. If you are currently enrolled in a PPO option and don't take action, your current coverage will roll over.
 - 2. If you are currently enrolled in an HDHP plan, you must re-elect your HSA contributions each year.
- 3. **Review beneficiary designations.** Even if you don't make changes, log in to Dayforce to ensure the information is current.

To help you understand these changes, the Employee Benefits and Wellness Office is hosting virtual and inperson information sessions to walk you through your options. The virtual sessions will be recorded and available for playback. <u>Register to save your spot</u>.


